# THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

The church office is hard at work compiling the annual congregational report. The report has lots of information about all sorts of wonderful things God is doing in and through Fairmont. But behind all the narratives lies a huge question for Fairmont or any church: how do we evaluate faithfulness?

I have slowly come to the conclusion that the faithfulness of a congregation is observable but not necessarily quantifiable. If you want to observe the best measure of faithfulness, watch the quality of relationships between people in the church. Do they trust each other? Do they share? Is there a sense of common purpose and mutual support? Do we forgive each other when we mess up? Are newcomers genuinely welcomed or merely tolerated? And are people eager to serve or dread it? For me these are the true measures of faithfulness that get to the core of what Jesus wanted for his church and his people.

So, how are we doing? I see a community of faith that is growing in confidence to embrace all sorts of new people, some of whom would never formally join the church, but are loved nonetheless. I see a community of caring that are increasingly able to share in our vulnerabilities and support each other in pain and share in joys. I see a community of service where women and men eagerly strive to serve each other and our broader community. And on Sunday mornings I see a community of nurture where our youngest and our oldest are cherished, welcomed, and embraced just as they are.

Jesus never asked us to get bigger, although we are doing that. Jesus never asked us to be more financially sound, although we are doing that too. Jesus did ask us to welcome the little children, which is happening so beautifully. Jesus did ask us to care for one another, which we share so intimately. And most of all Jesus told us to be faithful and from where I sit on the chancel, we are going exactly where Jesus wanted us to follow.

I am most grateful to be in this place of ministry where there is genuine community and faith in action. Thank you for all the ways you have already expressed your love and support. I am also grateful to have such a wonderful family who will be with me during the surgery and afterwards during my time at home.

Beloved Christian mystic, Julian of Norwich, when speaking of God's nearness to us in the midst of our human condition, wrote "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well."

I am filled with such peace and genuine joy knowing that I am loved by you and by our God.

# **Adult Education**

**Pastor's Bible Study**: Pastor Brian and Pastor Kelley will be leading a new Pastor's Bible Study beginning Thursday, February 7, at 1:00 p.m. in the Upper Room. We will be examining the Scripture passage to be preached the following Sunday. Everyone is welcome!

**Connections:** The Book of Revelation, it's not as scary as you might think...

Join us on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 p.m. for our midweek adult education class currently studying the Book of Revelation, what many including John Calvin and Martin Luther thought was the weirdest book in the New Testament. #### **BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP**

**Progress in the 2019 financial stewardship campaign** is encouraging, and we are closing in on our goal of fully funding our pledging goal of \$609,367. The ultimate success of our 2019 Stewardship campaign depends on you. If you have already pledged for 2019 we sincerely thank you. If you have not yet done so, please pledge some amount to the mission of Fairmont. God has a plan for Fairmont and we hope that you will pledge to help achieve it with your financial support!

What is Per Capita and why is it \$48.20? The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. That means that we share in mutual ministry and accountability with and for each other. One of the ways we do that is by sharing in the cost of the denomination. This is done through individual assessments based on the number of members in each church. These assessments, called "per capita," are mandatory and are used to support the work of the General Assembly and the Synod. Those funds are obtained either from our general Fairmont revenues or from special offerings of individuals who wish to pay their share individually. The total per member assessment for 2019 is \$48.20. That is the cost of being a member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination as opposed to the local congregation. If you would like to directly pay your share of our commitment to the greater church, the amount per member is \$48.20.

New Ways to Give that Save Money: Taxpayers over 70 ½ years of age with an IRA or a 401K/403B accounts may transfer withdrawals (up to \$100,000 per year) directly to Fairmont Presbyterian Church or other "qualified charitable organizations" and not pay tax on the distribution. Retirement savings accounts of various sorts require individuals over 70 ½ to annually make required minimum distributions or face significant tax penalties. Those distributions are then added to your taxable income, often boosting your tax bracket. But, if you direct those distributions in whole or in part to Fairmont or other charities, those funds do not count as taxable income. This transfer method can save you significant tax dollars. As always, consult with qualified advisors to help with tax planning, but using qualified charitable distributions may be an efficient way for you to support Fairmont!



**Coins 4 Kids**—Fairmont family, we need your help! Over the past several years, all coins collected during the offering have gone into our Coins4Kids fund, a special fund to help offset the cost of Kirkmont camp for our children and youth who attend. From this fund, Fairmont is able to pay half of the camp cost for each attendee, helping our parents and encouraging them to send their kids to Kirkmont.

From Kirkmont's website: "Kirkmont Center, an independent non-profit organization, was founded by the Presbyterian Church USA in 1963. Today we are a camp and retreat center serving public and private school groups, non-profit organizations, youth groups, sports teams, music and art associations, churches and faith based groups of all denominations, families, businesses, and individuals. Our goal is to provide you with a renewing camp, outdoor education, or retreat experience."

Our numbers at Fairmont are growing, and we have more children and youth attending summer camp at Kirkmont. As a result, our Coins4Kids fund is shrinking faster than it is being replenished. It is a good problem to have, but we need your help to keep the fund growing for our children and youth. **Please remember to bring your coins to put in the Sunday morning offering plate. You can also write a check with "Coins4Kids" in the memo line.** Thank you for your help in encouraging our growing young Christians!
