Lent, just like the rest of Christian life, only more so

Starting on Ash Wednesday we begin our annual pilgrimage walking beside Jesus from the Galilee to Jerusalem and beyond. Along the way we will be confronted by many curious and often contrary people. And at our journey's end, after a final meal imbued with more meanings than we will ever understand, we will walk with him through betrayal, accusation, abandonment, pain, and ultimately death. It sounds like such fun that most people ignore it.

Lent is a season for brutal honesty. Our world is a mess and will not save us. Other people are a mess and cannot save us. We are a mess and cannot free ourselves. There are no shortcuts. There is only the way ahead. Lent is less a journey and more a meditation on our travelling companion who shows us what it means to be human and live in relationship with our curious God.

Two thousand years ago in a fresh-cut tomb just outside the walls of Jerusalem, something happened that simultaneously transformed and disclosed the nature of reality and humanity. To appreciate and contribute in that something, however provisionally, we must share in the story, take up our role in it, be swept off our feet, and find ourselves not only in a new place, but as new people. Welcome to Lent. Jerusalem beckons.
