THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:21

While serving as an attorney, I learned that if you want to find out what a person's real intentions and commitments are, follow the money. It may be a crass way of expressing it, but a person's finances follow her or his values illuminating what we really believe and hold dear as opposed to those things we only say are important.

So, here is an important spiritual discipline. What does your bank statement say about who you are and what you value? What is important and what is not in your life? Do your choices of how you spend your money reflect those values? There are no right or wrong answers to these questions. The questions simply focus us on who we really are versus who we think we are or who we say we are.

Somebody asked me, "How much should I give?" You need to give such that it makes a difference in your life. Giving changes us. Giving makes us more generous. Giving makes us more grateful. If your giving makes no impact on any choices in your life, you probably do not give enough. If your giving imposes undue stresses and hardships then you probably give too much. The question is not so much one of numbers, but rather a matter for careful self-assessment.

Do you value your role as a disciple of Jesus Christ and your part in the chain of witnesses? Do you value this community, Fairmont Presbyterian Church, in our ongoing proclamation of the Gospel and formation of disciples? Generations have committed their time, their labor, and their money so that our ministry may flourish and bring the Good News to you. Now it is our turn. On Sunday November 10, we will be sharing our financial commitments to the ministry of Jesus here in our community of Fairmont. What values will you express?

NOTES FROM KELLEY

In the heart of this Stewardship season at Fairmont Presbyterian Church, we take time to be still and consider *why we give* and *for whom we give*. Stewardship is much more than fundraising. Stewardship is proclaiming, "We have a vision to which God has called us, and we are inviting you to bring your gifts, your passion, and your money, to be part of this work to which God has called us!"

Thanks to Rachel's leadership, our children's programs are thriving. I heard the Spirit when I dropped off my grandchildren at children's choir practice and saw the room full of young voices singing praises to God. What a blessing it is to see the chancel steps full of young worshipers during children's talk on Sundays.

Yes, the Spirit is alive, well and growing at Fairmont. One can sense it in the willingness of our members to serve on church boards. The countless hours spent by our members in service to Women of Fairmont speaks to the Spirit's presence. What if Everyone Tithed? Somebody asked me a good question. What would happen if everyone at Fairmont tithed? Tithing is the Biblical practice of using one tenth of your income for the work of ministry. If every current Fairmont member did that we would share (and this is based on some extrapolations from Kettering census data) approximately 2.3 million dollars for ministry every year (that is more than four times what is currently given). With those resources we could transform the lives of children and young people in our community, glorify God in worship through new commissioned music and artwork, provide free or subsidized child care for parents in need, offer community concerts and workshops, expand our outreach to college campuses and young people, add additional worship services at times other than Sunday morning, hold regular retreats, provide weekly community meals and learning opportunities for people of all ages, deepen our support for local schools, partner with community health ministries, and provide new care and support for older adults both at Fairmont and at local care centers. These are just some of the possibilities if we all tithed together. It may sound like a dream, but all it would take to become a reality is a choice and a commitment.

No prior experience or training needed. We meet Sunday afternoon, once a month with activities lasting 1-2 hours. Several Fairmont members attended the Out of the Darkness Walk Sunday, October 20th which was organized by the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. Member Sallie Luther did a fabulous job of speaking at the event and helping to coordinate it. At first count over 2,000 people attended-more than ever! It was a wonderful hike of over a mile through Oakwood. Fairmont was announced as a major sponsor of the event and our logo was displayed on the event's t-shirts. At the walk, people wear different colored bead necklaces to signify their personal connection to the cause. A young lady jogged the course wearing an Army rucksack, next to a man with an American flag, only stopping because the rucksack's strap began to break. They both wore silver necklaces to signify the loss of a first responder or military member. Before the walk began, a young woman spoke about the meaning of her several strings of beads and how much she appreciated all of the people walking in solidarity with her. What a wonderful gift Fairmont gave to the community!
