Connections Returns: Healing Our Pain

Starting on Wednesday September 9 at 7:00 on Zoom, join us for our new Connections class, Healing our Pain--trauma, bodies, and race. Over the past several months our nation has entered into a new conversation about race in America. At the foundation of that conversation is pain—the pain of people of color, the pain of white people, and the pain of law enforcement officers. The Session and the Christian Formation Team recognized that Fairmont's role in this conversation is to nurture and equip people to go deeper into understanding, self-awareness, and compassion. On Wednesday nights on Zoom we will be sharing together in Resmaa Menakem's work on trauma and race. Each class will include video presentations and discussion. This well-known melody was created to provide a choral setting for J. C. F. von Schiller's poem, "An die Freude" (To Joy), as the final movement of the composer's *Ninth Symphony*. The author, a prominent Presbyterian pastor and author, wrote the words with this tune in mind.

TEXT: Henry van Dyke, 1907, alt.

MUSIC: Ludwig van Beethoven, 1824; adapt. Edward Hodges, 1842, alt.



As paraphrases of 1 Corinthians 13:1, 3 the first two stanzas here are in the first person singular, yet they lead into a plural prayer for the gift of such love, for it thrives in community. These words are especially poignant with this adaptation of an English folk melody.



This hymn of consecration radiates from the repeated word "take," resulting in a remarkably full survey of a person's attributes and possessions and giving weight to the "all" at the end. The composer of the tune was influential in the renewal of Reformed hymnody in French.
