BUDGET AND STEWARDSHIP

Thank You! Thank you for your generous financial support throughout 2018. Because of your generosity we have been able to expand the array of our programs and ministries especially for younger people, send our youth to church camp and on mission trips, make major improvements to our building, refurbish our hand bells, hire new staff, and expand our support to mission partners, all while welcoming new members. All of it depends on your generous support. You are making Fairmont a great and thriving house of faith.



New Ways to Give that Save Money: Taxpayers over 70 ½ years of age with an IRA or a 401K/403B accounts may transfer withdrawals (up to \$100,000 per year) directly to Fairmont Presbyterian Church or other "qualified charitable organizations" and not pay tax on the distribution. Retirement savings accounts of various sorts require individuals over 70 ½ to annually make required minimum distributions or face significant tax penalties. Those distributions are then added to your taxable income, often boosting your tax bracket. But, if you direct those distributions in whole or in part to Fairmont or other charities, those funds do not count as taxable income. This transfer method can save you significant tax dollars. As always, you should consult with qualified advisors to help with tax planning, but using qualified charitable distributions may be an efficient way for you to support Fairmont!

Christmas is around the corner, and so is Jeremiah's Letter!

The Mission Team is focusing our Christmas giving efforts on one project this year: Jeremiah's Letter. As in the past, this project provides local families with the ingredients for a nice Christmas dinner with additional groceries along with gifts for the family. We will be posting the color-coded trees with requested gift items for you to purchase and wrap. More details will be coming! With this increased local focus of our time and treasure, we will not be collecting Shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child or the Christmas Joy Offering.

3rd Sunday Mission Project: All Saints care and support. On

November 18, we are writing notes of Love and Encouragement to family members of those members who died in the past year and are recognized on All-Saints Day. Join us in Fellowship Hall after each service to send your note to folks still grieving as the holidays approach. Many loving hands are needed to write these caring notes.

Dayton Fisher House: A Fisher House is a compassionate care facility much like a Ronald McDonald House, except these homes are for veterans and their families. Currently, 78 of these homes exist at military bases and VA medical centers in the United States, England, and Germany. Those 78 homes are now able to support 1,000 families each night. The Dayton area is blessed by having three of these homes: two at Wright Patterson AFB with a total of 21 bedrooms, and the newest one with 16 bedrooms at the Dayton VA. Dayton is now able to provide 37 room nights each day of the week or 13,505 room nights each year with a savings to our veterans and their families of over 2 million dollars a vear in hotel costs.

Ground breaking for the new Fisher House occurred on October 23, 2017. One year later, the first family stayed at the new Fisher House on October 21, 2018. Ribbon cutting will be on November 7, 2018 at 2:00 p.m. at the Fisher House at the Dayton VA. Please know that you are welcome to tour the new facility that day!

There will be some pictures of the completed house shown on the TV monitors in the Fellowship Hall after both church services on November 4. Please come visit in person as the pictures don't do justice to the actual facility!

THANK YOU from Fisher Nightingale Houses, Inc. for the contributions made by Fairmont members to this very fine facility. With our collective contributions, our veterans who have done so much for all of us and their families will be able to use this facility for years to come.

Veterans Day Program: A luncheon to honor our Veterans is being planned for 12:00 noon on Saturday, November 10, 2018 in the Fellowship Hall. The event will include an introduction by Ken Ginader, playing of the service songs, and a brief talk by Bob Kasprzak from the Dayton Chapter of the League of WWI Aviation Historians. This year marks the 100th Anniversary of the end of WWI. Bob will talk about the 28th Aero Squadron and its participation in WWI. The 28th Aero Squadron was an Air Service, US Army unit prior to the establishment of the United States Army Air Service in 1920. The 28th Aero Squadron fought on the Western Front during WWI and was assigned as a Day Pursuit (Fighter) Squadron as part of the 3th Pursuit Group, First United States Army.

All Veterans of Fairmont Presbyterian Church and their spouses and guests are invited to attend. There is no cost to attend the luncheon. Mark the date on your calendar and please join us to learn about the 28th Aero Squadron and it's exploits during WWI.
