6. If you are able, please drop your card(s) off at the Fairmont church office. If you would like to mail them to Fairmont in a separate envelope, that is also an option.

JESUS CHRIST: LIFE



Few songs of faith have supported people from cradle to grave like this one. The great theologian Karl Barth said that its opening two lines were a summary of all that he had learned. The composer formed the refrain from those lines when creating this universally used tune.

This text emphasizes the covenantal dimensions of baptism, most obvious in the baptism of children (though also present in the baptism of adults), including the worshiping community's commitment to acquaint children with salvation history and to learn from their humble trust.
