# Fairmont Presbyterian Church

As I write this, we are preparing for Trinity Sunday. Trinity is the least understood, most ignored, and at the same time most important idea that holds all of Christianity as well as our lives with God, together. Saint Augustine once quipped, "not to think on the Trinity is to risk heresy, but to think on the Trinity is to risk lunacy." So, it becomes a vague symbol, something we know we are supposed to believe in even though it makes no sense and no difference in our life and in our world.

My teacher, Richard Rohr, wrote, "The mystery of Trinity is embedded as the code in everything that exists." By that he meant that Trinity is the word we use to summarize the dynamic pattern that emerges and repeats itself at every level of creation, which mirrors the dynamic pattern of who God is. Creation is an icon of God and the shape of that image is relationship.

The Christian notion of Trinity suggests that God is less a noun and more a verb, a process, action, procession, and relationship, not just because of what God does, but as God really is. In the ancient church, Gregory of Nazianzus coined the Greek term *perichoresis*, literally dancing around together, to describe what God is like in Trinity. It is not that God is three people dancing together. God is the dance itself. This has three hugely important implications. First, God is relationship. God's own nature is relational, an eternal procession of love and friendship. There is no hierarchy or ruling over in Trinity, only giving away, sharing, and letting go. Second, creation is simply the overflowing of that love and relationship taking form in matter and energy. Much like a fountain's overflowing mist on a frigid day takes static form as ice, so to this world and our lives are merely the spun off concrete expression of God's overabundance of love. Third, there is room in God for us. If God is a more like a circle dance, then there is always room to join. The dance only becomes larger as others join it. The pattern, which is God's eternal character, remains constant as it sweeps up all the bits of God's creation, including you and me, as partners. We do not become God. We join in with God.

If this all sounds rather abstract, it is as close as your deepest desire. We all want belonging. We all want connection. We all want love. The ache for this connection is the absence we feel apart from who we were meant to be in and with God. We can try to numb that ache with work, things, pleasures, and chemicals, but none will fill the absence. The hole is not merely in our hearts, but in our being and it is shaped like God who alone can fill it.

Jesus invited us into a new life and a new world on earth as it is in heaven and the way of heaven is the divine dance of Trinity. All the twisted prepositions Jesus uses--in God, with God, and through God--make perfect sense if you simply begin with the image of Trinity. He is not trying to describe a static arrangement. Jesus is trying to describe a dance. All his metaphors about being the vine and we are the branches, mutually indwelling in and with each other and God, are all expressions of this fundamental relationship stamped on the heavens and in our hearts.

Perhaps the most amazing thing about Trinity is that because we are made in its form and image, we are invited to practice it. We practice living into Trinity whenever and wherever we entangle our lives with others in self-giving, yielding, loving, and letting go. Love and friendship are not mere emotions. Love and friendship are the concrete expression in our lives of who God is. Loving and befriending others are our ways of practicing here and now what it will be like to live in God as Trinity into eternity.

May it be on earth and in our lives as it is in heaven.

We focused on a behindthe-scenes look at music composition and how the music which is created has specific intent to invoke feelings and connections for those who share in it as performers and listeners. There is an inspirational, other-worldly quality that can create a physiological response in our bodies and spirits when music can "cross that strange abyss and connect us."
